As a Secondary School Teaching Intern, you will primarily assist teachers with facilitating their classes. You may be expected to work with small groups, develop teaching materials and assist with informal and formal assessment opportunities.

- Work closely with assigned mentor teachers in the daily planning and implementing of lesson plans
- Assistance with small groups of students when required
- Prepare, support and leading lessons, or small group sessions, under the supervision of the mentor teacher
- Assist with classroom management and student well-being
- Work alongside teaching staff with the ongoing development of teaching and learning activities
- Complete set supervision duties in the playground as allocated
- Observe lessons both within and outside your faculty area
- Participate in, and contribute to, staff meetings and professional development as appropriate
